Charm Pack Quilt



You need: 42 – 5" charm squares 25" x WOF (at least 40") of solid border fabric 10" x WOF (at least 40") for binding Backing and batting – needs to be bigger than 38" x 42½"

- 1. Layout charms as shown in picture.
- 2. Cut solid border fabric into 4 strips of 2³/₄" x WOF (for the inner borders) and 4 strips of 3¹/₂" x WOF (for the outer border).
- 3. From each 2³/₄" solid strip, sub cut a 9 ¹/₂" strip (for innermost border) and a 23" strip (for middle border). You will have 4 of each. Remaining fabric goes into your scrap stash.
- 4. Stitch this quilt using ¼" seam allowance. Start with the center 2 charms. Add the 9½" solid strips of the innermost border to this charm set, sides first then the top and bottom. For the second ring, sew sets of 3 charms down for the right and left sides and 4 charms each across for the top and bottom. After sewing the charms together into strips, add them to the solid border, sides first then top and bottom. Now add the 23" solid strips for the middle border, sides first then top and bottom. For the third ring sew 6 charms down for each side and 7 charms across for the top and bottom. Add these charm strips to the previous solid border, sides first then top and bottom.
- 5. You're now ready for the outer borders which use the 3½" strips. Since these strips were cut the width of the fabric, they are longer than needed. Measure the sides of your quilt. Depending on the accuracy of your ¼" seam, the side borders will be approximately 36½". Cut 2 strips to your measurement; sew them to the sides. Measure your quilt across the top and bottom. Again, depending on your accuracy, the top and bottom borders will measure about 38". Trim the remaining 3½" strips to your measurement and sew them in place.
- 6. Baste and quilt as desired.
- 7. Cut 4 2¹/₂" strips from your binding fabric to bind and finish quilt. Add a love tag.
